

# LET MY PRAYER BE SET FORTH

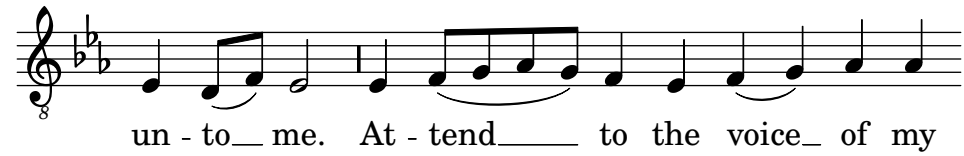
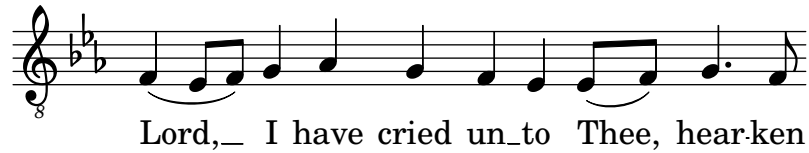
Valaam Chant

*When the reader has finished the second Prophecy, the deacon again intones "Wisdom," and while all prostrate themselves, the reader chants thus:*

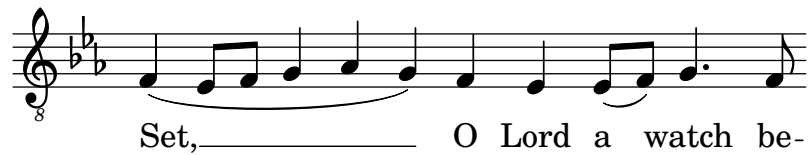


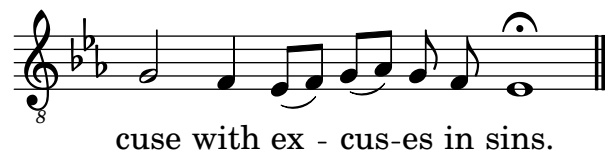
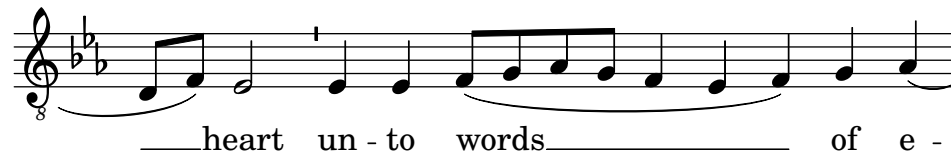
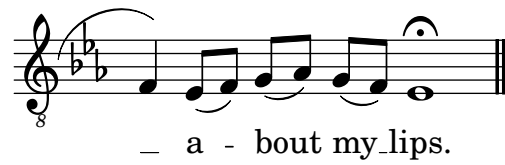
Let my prayer  
be set forth as in

the lift-ing up of my hands as an eve -  
ning sac - ri-fice.

*And the choir repeats the same while the reader makes a prostration. When the reader has arisen, all prostrate again and the reader chants the verse:*



*And the choir again chants the refrain, "Let my prayer be set forth," Likewise with the subsequent verses:*





*Finally, without prostrations, the reader chants the first half of the refrain, and we respond with the second:*

Ÿ. Let my prayer be set forth as incense before Thee;

℞ . The lifting up of my hands as an evening sacrifice.
